Why do we ask for this information?

Every person who drives a car in connection with a Scouting activity must carry a minimum of \$50,000/\$100,000/\$50,000 of automobile liability limits on their vehicle. Buses and vans must carry \$100,000/\$500,000/\$100,000 liability limits. The council's automobile liability insurance is in excess of the insurance the owner of the auto carries, but does protect the owner above his limits for the council's \$1,000,000 limit coverage plus the \$15,000,000 limits of the umbrella liability. If you are involved in an accident while carrying Scouts to or from a covered activity and we have your insurance information on file, you and the Troop's volunteer leaders will be covered by the BSA's insurance policies.

2014-2015 Driver's Pledge

1. I will not drive when I feel fatigued. I realize that when I am fatigued, I process information more slowly and less accurately and this impairs my ability to react in time to avoid accidents.
2. I will arrange my schedule so that several days before a Boy Scout "driving trip," I will get a good night's sleep every night to avoid the cumulative effect of not getting enough sleep.
3. I will make trip preparations far enough in advance so that last-minute preparations don't interfere with my rest.
4. I will make travel plans that take into account my personal biological clock and only drive during the part of the day when I know I will be alert.
5. I will be smart about engaging in physical activities during Scouting outings and will make sure that I will be ready to drive alertly.
